

From the Pastor's desk...

As we come to the end of the Advent Season and the beginning of the Christmas Season, the various prophetic readings are beginning to make sense as God's plan becomes concrete through the "fiat" of the Virgin Mary and the cooperation of Saint Joseph who in a vision of an Angel was told, "Joseph son of David do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her... When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took his wife into his home." The Gospel both reveals the element of surprise in the divine drama and the mixture of the human and the divine in the mystery of salvation. While the Virgin Mary becomes the bearer of the divine mystery, Saint Joseph becomes the protector and guardian of the incarnate Son of God. Though not much is known or heard from Joseph, the few lines reveal his deep faith, devotion and integrity, for he was a "righteous man" who placed the safety and integrity of Mary above his sense of righteousness. Indeed, God found the right husband and foster father for the Virgin Mary and Jesus respectively. Thus, God is born in the human family, and the Word took flesh and dwelt amongst us!

Clearly, what stands out in the Gospel passage is the obedience and cooperation of Joseph in accepting his fatherhood over the Son of God. This is an affirmation of God's plan for family life, that children should be born and raised in a healthy family environment of two parents, man and woman. It is an established scientific fact that both fathers and mothers play a significant role in the human and spiritual development of children! These roles cannot be compensated for by either of the parents, even given the growing trend of absentee fathers in many homes. According to the Marriage and Religion Research Institute, 1 in 3 children in the United States live in a fatherless home, and by age 17 only 46% are living with both parents. The institute goes further to mention the robust benefits of children growing with a father, this is in contrast to the social ills attributed to children growing up without fathers in their homes. Though radical feminism is being blamed for this modern trend, the issue is past a blame game. Fatherhood and motherhood are the fundamental rights of every child. Therefore, we all must work together to affirm this truth regardless of our religious and political divide. This is only healthy for our society. According to the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Administration for Children and Families (ACF), and the Office of Family Assistance (OFA), "Fathers are essential to the social, emotional and economic well-being of their children and families." And I dare to add that fathers are equally essential for the spiritual wellbeing of their children. Yes, Joseph provided the example and stability Jesus needed to live his human existence while enriching the home of Joseph and Mary with his divine radiance! At this juncture, I affirm all fathers in their vocation of fatherhood, with all the aches and satisfactions. I enjoin mothers to affirm the fatherhood of their spouses and to work with their husbands to rediscover and reestablish the beauty and value of fathers within the family, amidst the growing cynicism and ridicule of fatherhood.

On behalf of Deacon Keith Pavlik, Rita Pavlik and Jean Pavelka, I wish you and your family a delightful Christmas and a joyous New Year. Thank you for your stewardship; and for the Christmas cards and gifts. Enjoy your family and keep the Christmas spirit alive and may Christ be born in your heart anew! God bless you.


